This week, we had the pleasure of interviewing Leticia Harris, whose art exhibit “Reflections on Solitude” opened to great praise this month. Leticia spoke with us about the challenges of being an artist and about the creative process.

- Q:** So Leticia, “Reflections on Solitude” is your first major exhibit, and, at 62, success as an artist has come to you relatively late in life. Can you talk to us about the struggles of becoming a successful artist?

A: Of course. But I would start by saying that one of the reasons success has come a little later for me is that I got into art pretty late in life as well. I wasn’t at all passionate about art when I was younger. My mind set was much more analytical and technical. In fact, I spent most of my career doing designs for large engineering firms. It’s only been the last ten years or so that I’ve really turned my attention to art. But, yes, ten years is a long time to work on something before you achieve any kind of success or recognition. I don’t think of it as ten years wasted, though. I like to think that each piece of art I’ve created, even the ones that never sold, has helped little by little to build me into the artist I am today. So, if it has been a struggle, I feel it’s been a necessary one.
- Q:** Your work has been praised for its amazing creativity. What is your creative process like?

A: You know, the funny thing is I don’t even really consider myself to be all that imaginative. Like I said, my background is in engineering. But I guess I’m pretty good at noticing the natural patterns that occur in my daily environment, like the angles of buildings or the curves in a tree’s branches, and using those patterns in my art.

Q: What impact do you think your art has on society?

A: That’s a tricky question. As the artist, I’m obviously biased. I’m not sure I can answer that. But I can talk about the effect I hope it has. More than anything, I hope that my work encourages people to observe their world a little more closely, and to find the little hidden patterns and beauty within it.
