Natalia Gomez, accountant, on job-sharing

I'm an accountant and I've been job-sharing for the last six months. I used to work full-time and, although I enjoyed my job, I used to work very long hours. About a year ago, I got sick and was advised by my doctor to take some time off work to recover. So I went on vacation and had time to assess my situation. Working long hours was so stressful that it was damaging my health. I turned to my boss, and she was very understanding and suggested that I could job-share. So I contacted my friend Luke, who is also an accountant and was looking for a job. Now, Luke and I job-share, and it's going very well! Just the perfect work-life balance!

Tyler Hall, editor, on freelancing and co-working spaces

I am an editor and I work on projects for magazines, websites, and advertising agencies. I used to work on a team at a large book publishing company. I enjoyed the work, but I wanted to have more independence, to choose the types of projects I worked on, and to do more varied work. So I left my job and set myself up as a freelance editor. After working alone for a month, though, I realized that I really missed other people and I felt very isolated and lonely. Then someone mentioned a co-working space downtown. The place is a large office space, especially for freelancers, divided up into smaller offices and meeting rooms. The rent we pay every month covers our desk space and bills such as electricity and cleaning. It is just the ideal situation for me: I can work independently and, at the same time, enjoy the company of others.
