**To click or not to click**

E-commerce is changing the main street and our shopping habits irrevocably. We tell ourselves that shopping online saves us time and money, and that it is a more comfortable way to shop. However, is that actually true?

One of the most attractive aspects of online shopping is being able to do it in the comfort of your own home. Not having to go out into the cold, walk long distances, or deal with unpleasant salespeople holds a lot of appeal to most customers. Another advantage is simply the variety and quantity of products available. A website is obviously not limited by space as the bricks-and-mortar stores are. Furthermore, since online stores don't usually have to spend money on rent and are able to purchase larger quantities of each product, they tend to offer lower prices and better discounts than traditional businesses.

However, won't we be missing out on something if the main street stores disappear? What about the event of going shopping itself? Won't we miss the sociable, fun event of meeting with friends and browsing the stores together? Also, going shopping on the main street sometimes means walking around from place to place, which in itself can be very healthy and pleasant exercising. Finally, fans of e-commerce claim it saves us precious time, which could be better spent on more important things. Yet if the items purchased online turn out to be different from what was expected and have to be exchanged, or if packages are delayed or lost and need to be tracked, this may not be the case.

Perhaps there is room for both ways of shopping and we all just need to find the perfect balance that can be the most beneficial to our lives.
