Developments in Translation Tools

When someone is asked to translate a text, ¹ *inevitably / demonstrably* their first instinct is to use an online translating tool. Master Clickbait – Master Your Life

Most people are familiar with clickbait, those irresistible headlines that appear around online articles. Some call it a cheap, and sometimes dishonest, marketing tactic. In some cases, they are right. Others argue that if clickbait is here to stay, then we might as well get good at it. After all, if done well, it's one of the best ways to get people's attention. So, what makes a headline clickbait?

It only takes a few hours studying clickbait headlines to see patterns. (Only if you don't start clicking them; otherwise it could take you weeks!) Clickbait appeals to basic human needs: health, success, money, knowledge, fun, etc. It often does this by preying on strong negative emotions like greed, fear, and envy.

To capture attention, an information gap should be included in your headline—a gap which can only be filled by clicking through to a new page.

An example: "Top entrepreneurs everywhere are using this simple trick to boost income."

What's missing? We want to know what the trick is. But there is more going on here. "Top entrepreneurs" appeals to envy – we want to be a top entrepreneur. "Simple" means it will be easy to learn (in theory anyway!). As for "boost income," well, who doesn't want more of the green stuff!

Another trick is "newsjacking" – integrating a topic in the public eye (the Olympics, the Oscars, the president) into publicity and relating it to your product. You need to react quickly, as hot news topics tend to have a short life cycle. Imagine you have written a book about "morning routines." Your headline could read "Five things you didn't know about the president's morning routine."

These tips will get people to your page, and when they do, I hope you have something good to say!
