**How To Get the Remote Job of Your Dreams**

In recent years, the number of employees working mainly from home has increased dramatically. Employers love the benefits of increased productivity and lower costs. Workers love the flexibility and reduced travel time. Understandably, despite the increase in remote positions, competition for such jobs is high. So how can you make sure you ace the interview to get that remote job of your dreams?

First, you have to be equipped with the latest computer systems and tools and be able to use them well. Communication will be via video conference, texts, and email. Show you can communicate effectively and concisely on these platforms. If you are not familiar with the tools of the trade, then you may be overlooked. Companies may hold interviews with such tools and will observe carefully how confidently you use them. They may also check how you interact on social media, so ensure your online presence will have a positive impact.

Secondly, since you will be working unsupervised, you will need to show evidence that you can motivate yourself. In your interview, you should be ready to present examples of how you work productively alone. Employers will seek previous remote experience, so if you don't have it, get it. Look for freelance work or solo projects that show you can do amazing things by yourself.

Finally, you need to be disciplined in managing your time. Make sure you bring to your interview examples of projects that show how you have coordinated your workload to meet deadlines. You might be asked how you prioritize tasks and manage distractions.

Like any other interview, you should be informed about the company and the role. Sell yourself as the perfect candidate for the job rather than overselling the fact that you want to work remotely.
